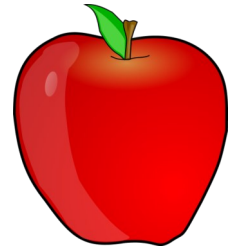

Michigan Art Association Winners

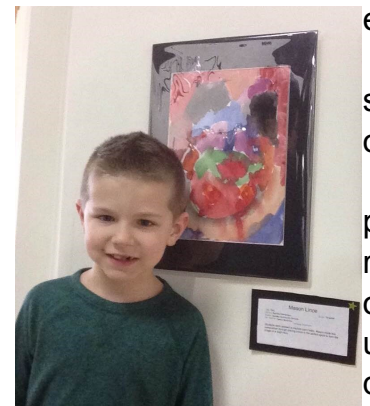
We are excited to announce that the following students were recognized at the State Level in the Region 10 Michigan Art Education Competition:
