Student Safety

We are very concerned with the safety of our students at Barhitte.

The School complies with all fire safety laws and conducts fire drills in compliance with State Laws. Specific instructions on how to proceed are provided to students by their teachers who are responsible for safe, prompt, and orderly evacuation of the building.

Tornado drills are conducted during the tornado season using the procedures provided by the State..

Lockdown drills and evacuation drills are practiced throughout the school year to be prepared in the event of an emergency.

We are also concerned about Stranger Danger. Please speak with your children about how to react in the event they are approached by a Stranger.

The following are stranger safety tips that should be followed:

- ♦ Don't talk to strangers.
- ♦ Don't take anything from strangers.
- ♦ Don't go anywhere with someone you don't know.
- Stay more than an arm's reach away from strangers. If you are approached by a stranger, run to a safe place.
- ◆ Trust your instincts—if you feel you are being followed or something is not right, seek help immediately.
- ♦ Use the buddy system-avoid walking anywhere alone.
- If a stranger approaches you, you do not have to speak to him or her. Never approach a stranger in a motor vehicle. Just keep walking or running. Do not accept candy or any other items from a stranger. Never walk off with a stranger no matter what he or she tells you.
- If a stranger grabs you, do everything you can to stop him or her from pulling you away or dragging you into his or her car. Drop to the ground, kick, hit, bite, and scream. Do whatever it takes to attract the attention of others who can help you. If someone is dragging you away, scream, "this is not my dad", or "this is not my mom".

Reminder!!

Please call the office at 591-9661 if your child is going to be absent from school. In order to have an absence verified, a parent needs to call the office with the reason for absence. If no call is made it is marked as an unexcused absence.

Children who have a fever of 100.0 or greater, or who are vomiting, will need to be picked up from school, or kept home from school, if the symptoms happen at home.
